From the Pastor's Desk:

Thanksgiving Day now is history but being thankful – grateful to God for what He has given us still should be in our hearts.

This year has been eventful if not crazy. Our town has seen it raining "cats and dogs" along with hurricanes, power outages, flooding, and we're still looking for fall weather and its December!

You still see evidence of Hurricane Helene across the area – even here in the church parking lot. But that doesn't mean we should not be thankful. Psalm 107 tells us, "O give thanks unto the LORD, for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever." Paul tells us in 1 Thessalonians 5:18 to be thankful in everything – that means even when a tree falls on your house or you do not have electricity for a week.

A story about gratitude is told about a brother and sister who grew up poor in foster care. One day the brother's sponsor paid for him to go to Disney World. He was given \$10 to spend on drinks and souvenirs. It was not much money – especially for Disney World – but the boy was determined to spend it wisely. He had a great time at the amusement park but really wished his sister could have come.

Wanting her to experience something of the day, he bought her a little plate with her name on it. He bought his sponsor a thank you token from the park also. He didn't spend one penny on himself – he was grateful for the experience.

Late that afternoon when he saw his sister and gave her the plate, she looked at it and exclaimed, "what am I going to do with this useless cheap piece of glass." She was ungrateful. The story does not end there. The boy became a naval captain as an adult while his sister, still ungrateful and thinking the world owed her something, landed on the rolls of welfare.

For some, it's a hard lesson to learn to be grateful in all things, but that is a command of God. Yes, Thanksgiving Day has passed but we are entering a season the world should be thankful for.

We now are officially into the Christmas season – a time to celebrate with our family. It's a favorite time of year for the women – they get to go shopping. For some men, it's a time to risk life and limb to climb ladders and hang lights. But is that what this season is all about?

No. This is the season to celebrate God's gift to the entire world – from the beginning of time until the end of time – His Son. Jesus Christ came into this world, born of a virgin in a manger because the world did not have room for Him.

The story is told of a young reporter assigned to cover a story about a church that had recreated the complete story of Mary and Joseph arriving in Bethlehem. Actors played the part of people in the market, the inn where there was no room for the young couple,

The church dressed the reporter in a costume and she found herself yelling out to the crowd "No room!" In her story she stated some people got angry with her, but she felt sorry for Mary and Joseph because they looked so tired and dejected. The reporter began asking many questions about the Christmas story after that, and for a while started attending church.

Jesus was rejected by the world. In fact, after healing thousands of people – from the blind to the crippled – and feeding thousands of people, the world chose a criminal and menace to society over Jesus. Jesus was crucified.

Interestingly, Jesus had the power to call down thousands upon thousands of angels to destroy the world and set Him free. The truth is, He could have done that without any assistance – but He didn't. The reason is He loved the world so much, He wanted to do His Father's will and pay the price for all our sins, because without His sacrifice we all would

die and go to hell for eternity. We're all sinners. We all have broken God's laws. If you watch the news, you will hear momma's say their boy who was shot in a night club was a "good boy. RESOLUTION DETERMINING PROPERTY EXEMPT FROM AD VALOREM TAXATION



The Lowndes County Tax Assessors' Office has choose **NOT** to proceed to take Lighthouse Baptist Church to Court & has restore **FULLY** our tax-exempt status. Praise the Lord!!!!!

WHEREAS, Lighthouse Baptist

Church of Valdosta, Inc. ("Lighthouse Baptist") owns real property located at 4565 Bemiss Road. Lowndes County, Georgia, that the Lowndes County Board of Tax Assessors (the "Board") has assigned for ad valorem property tax purposes parcel number 0145C 176A (the "properly");

WHEREAS, based on information then available, the Board initially determined for purposes of 2024 ad valorem property taxes that the property was, as of January 1,2024, taxable;

WHEREAS, Lighthouse Baptist appealed the foregoing determination to the Lowndes County Board of Equalization (the "BOE"); WHEREAS, the BOE found the property to be exempt from ad valorem taxation:

WHEREAS, the Board appealed the decision of the BOE to the Superior Court of Lowndes County by giving a Petition for Review to Lighthouse Baptist pursuant to and in accordance with OCGA \$ 48-s-311(eX2);

WHEREAS, pursuant to and in accordance with OCGA \$ 48-5-31 1(gX2), the Board and Lighthouse Baptist participated in a settlement conference, which did not result in a settlement of the issue of the taxability of the property:

WHEREAS, also pursuant to and in accordance with OCGA \$ 48-5-3ll(g)(2), the Board thereafter timely filed its Petition for Review with the Superior Court of Lowndes County:

WHEREAS, the Board has continued to research and analyze applicable law and relevant facts regarding the taxability of the property:

WHEREAS, exemptions from ad valorem property taxation are set forth in and governed by OCGA \$ 48-5-al;

WHEREAS, based on applicable law and relevant facts, the Board has determined that, as of January 1,2024, the property was not exempt from ad valorem property taxation pursuant to OCGA \$ 48-5-41(2.1)(A) as a place of religious worship;

WHEREAS, based on applicable law and relevant facts, the Board has determined that, as of January I, 2024, the property was a WHEREAS, Lighthouse Baptist

not exempt from ad valorem property taxation pursuant to OCGA \$ 48-5-41(4) as property of an institution of purely public charity;

WHEREAS, based on applicable law and relevant facts, the Board has determined that, as of January 1,2024, the property was not exempt from ad valorem property taxation pursuant to

OCGA \$ 48-5-41(6) as a building erected for and used as a college. incorporated academy, or other seminary of learning;

WHEREAS, OCGA \$ 48-5-41(2.1XB), as applicable, provides All property owned by and operated exclusively as a church ..., when such entity is qualified as an exempt religious organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and such property is used in a manner consistent with such exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

WHEREAS, as of January 1,2024, the property was owned by a church;

WHEREAS, Lighthouse Baptist has provided facts that, as of January 1,2024, the property was operated exclusively as a church, for the reason that the property was used by Lighthouse Baptist primarily for a program of early care and learning for children based on the religious tenets of Lighthouse Baptist and otherwise incidentally as a church:

has represented that, as of January 1,2024, it was qualified as an exempt religious organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended:

WHEREAS, Lighthouse Baptist has also represented that, as of January 1,2024, the property was used in a manner consistent with such exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing applicable law and relevant facts, the Board has determined that, as of January 1,2024, the property was exempt from ad valorem property taxation pursuant to OCGA \$ 48-5-41(2.IXB);

NOW THEREFORE. based on the foregoing applicable law and relevant facts, the Board does hereby resolve to determine and does determine that, as of January 1,2024, the property was exempt from ad valorem property taxation pursuant to OCGA \$ 48-5-41(2.IXB). The Chief Appraiser shall cause the foregoing determination to be entered in the records of the Board and notice of the foregoing determination to be provided to the Tax Commissioner of Lowndes County. Legal counsel for the Board shall cause the action initiated by the filing of the Board's Petition for Review with the Superior Court of Lowndes County to be dismissed. IT IS SO RESOLVED, this

Frankl, survivor of a Nazi death camp, said, "The last of the human freedoms is to choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances." We all know, he's right -- we determine our attitudes in every situation, whether we know it or not. In this unpredictable and changing world, the one thing we can always control is the way we think.

While we have little control over circumstances or the actions of others, we CAN control our reactions to them. And anyone can learn how to think more positively and operate with a better attitude, regardless of circumstances, temperament, or intellect. To begin thinking more positively and leading your people to do the same, follow these guidelines:

ACT LIKE THE PERSON YOU WISH TO BECOME.

To start thinking positively, begin by ACTING positively. Most people wait until they FEEL LIKE it before taking action, but that's going about it backwards. Instead, you've got to act your way into thinking. By putting desires into action, you can establish a HABIT of thinking positively -- and the result is a positive attitude.

If you tend to think negatively, break that habit by choosing to have and exhibit a positive attitude. Besides improving your personal well-being, you'll model the actions you want your followers to take as well. As they see your commitment to being positive, they'll follow your example.

CULTIVATE A CONSISTENT POSITIVE ATTITUDE.

To reap a successful harvest, a farmer doesn't plant seeds and then just expect them to grow on their own. He must continually water, weed, fertilize and nurture the growing plants if he wants them to reach maturity.

Likewise, if we want a successful life, we need to spend time every day nurturing our attitude. We must nourish the seeds with a positive attitude, or they won't grow. And if we don't pay attention to our crop, weeds of negative thinking will spring up and choke the positive plants until they die.

Focus on what's positive and successful. Don't feed the weeds. As it says in (Philippians 4:8), "Whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report ... think on these things." (KJV).

LOOK FOR THE BEST IN EVERYONE.

Have you noticed that whenever you buy a new car, you suddenly see others driving that same model everywhere? I'm sure you've figured out that those other cars were there all along; you just weren't looking for them before. Now that you have that particular car yourself, your eye is trained to notice it. People really do see what they're prepared to see.

That's why it's so important to train yourself to look for the best in others. There is good in the worst of us and bad in the best of us, if we look for it hard enough. So whether you notice positive traits or imperfections depends almost entirely on what you CHOOSE to see. When we consciously look for the best in people, we allow their good traits to have a positive impact on our life and leadership.

LOOK FOR THE BEST IN NEW IDEAS.

You might believe that great ideas come only to the geniuses of the world. But in reality, discovering an idea is more a function of attitude than aptitude. An open-minded, creative person looks for ideas anywhere he can find them. He considers every option and doesn't reject anything until he's thoroughly examined it for any good he can find.

Thomas Edison, one of the world's great inventors, discovered some of his best inventions after other ideas went wrong, and he found another use for them. In fact, that's exactly what happened with the phonograph. If you keep an open mind and explore every idea presented to you, your people will follow your example. And the new ideas you discover together will contribute to your success.

Many people tend to take attitude for granted. They assume that they're stuck with the attitude that they have. Yet your outlook on life, as well as that of your people, can be changed. And the impact of positive thinking is so significant that it deserves regular attention. Take an attitude inventory today, and set yourself on the right track of positive thinking. Before you can change your world, you must first change the way you look at it.
